- Followers of 5th largest distinct religion - Sikhism
- 20 million people worldwide
- Appx 500,000 Sikhs living in United States
- CNN suggests rise in hatecrimes against sikhs due to mistaken dress resemblance with Taliban (totally seperate religion and culture.)



Sikhism

- A way of life and philosophy well ahead of its time when it was founded over 500 years ago.
- Sikhism is open to all through the teachings of its 10 Gurus enshrined in the Sikh Holy Book and Living Guru, Sri Guru Granth Sahib.



3 Pillars of Sikhism

- Earn an honest living
- Remember the creator in all times
- Share what you have with the needy.

Guru Nanak travelled for 27 years around the world meeting people of different religion, color and creed. His mission was not to convert anyone, but to inspire everyone to adopt a lifestyle based on the truth. Guru Nanak's message was simple with a universal appeal. He asked people of all religions to adopt three virtues listed below. These three virtues, prescribed by Guru Nanak, are considered the three pillars or the foundation of Sikh thought.

3 Pillars of Sikhism

👹 ਕਿਰਤ ਕਰਨਾ 🎬

Kirat Karna is the very first pillar prescribed by Guru Nanak. In its simplest form, it means to earn an honest living. He who doesn't contribute to the society has no right to claim benefit from it. The Guru reminds us to: ਉਦਮੁ ਕਰੇਦਿਆ ਜੀਉ ਤੂੰ ਕਮਾਵਦਿਆ ਸੁਖ ਭੁੰਚੁ ॥ ਧਿਆਇਦਿਆ ਤੂੰ ਪ੍ਰਭੂ ਮਿਲੁ ਨਾਨਕ ਉਤਰੀ ਚਿੰਤ ॥੧॥ Live with zest and abide in joy By doing hard and honest work, Obtain union with the Creator, Meditating upon the holy Name. Thus you would get rid of anxieties.

The second pillar prescribed by Guru Nanak is Naam Jaapna. Naam Jaapna means to meditate or remember the Creator. This can be done through Kirtan (singing hymns from Sri Guru Granth Sahib) or simply being aware of the Creator in our daily lives.

Status of Women

- Men and women equal in eyes of God
- Can perform all services and activities in the religion that men have privilege.
- The moral expectations expectation same for both men and women.
- No purdah, burqa, hijab is allowed.



Concept of Family

- "Baabanian Kahaanian, putt sputt krain," meaning that "Good children carry on the remembrance of their ancestors through stories and discussions."
- Strong emphasis on being a family person and remembering God, rather than denouncing worldly life.



Secularism

- Sikhs believe all paths which believe in truthful living lead to same God.
- The sacrifice of Guru Teg Bahadur Ji for Hindu faith
- Gurubani has composition of Hindu and Sufi Saints.
- Sikhism rejects all distinctions of caste, creed, race or sex.



Concept of Warrior

- One who has courage to stick with truth no matter what.
- The warrior fights and wins over his flickering mind everyday.
- The concept of equal dual.



Five cardinal vices

- Kam (lust)
- Krodh (anger)
- Lobh (greed)
- Moh (worldly attachment)
- Ahankar (pride).
